WHY a conference on water cooperation NOW?

This conference is preparatory for the **International Year of Water Cooperation 2013**, proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly. The objective of this International Year is to raise awareness, both on the potential for increased cooperation, and on the challenges facing water management in light of the increase in demand for water access, allocation and services. **World Water Day 2013** will also be dedicated to the theme of water cooperation.

WHAT is the FOCUS of the conference?

The conference focuses on processes that make cooperation happen. It does so by:

to promote effective cooperation processes at different scales.
